

A Word from the Pastor

"Every Christian knows that he must die to sin. But the great truth that St Paul exhausted himself to preach in season and out is a truth that we Christians have barely grasped, a truth that has got away from us, that constantly eludes us and has continued to do so for twenty centuries. We cannot get it into our heads what it means to be no longer slaves of the Law. And the reason is that we do not have the courage to face this truth which contains in itself the crucial challenge of our Christian faith, the great reality that makes Christianity different from every other religion." — T. Merton

Thomas Merton's writing on Easter is remarkable in that he writes in plain truth what is it to be Christian and to remind us of the great truth Christianity professes and that there is something else after our earthly life ends. Easter is the great reckoning we all must experience, a reckoning to cleanse ourselves of the sins heaped on us from the beginning of time. As Christians we rejoice this day and yell out Alleluia, Christ is risen! His resurrection gives us hope that life does not end because our temporal body ceases to exist, but rather our immortal soul continues on in a different fashion. Christ rose on this day to show us the way and relieve the burden of fear, anxiety and to build up our hope that something more wonderful is to come and that God is waiting for us to be His adopted sons and daughters once again.

"Christianity is precisely a liberation from every rigid legal and religious system. This is asserted with such categorical force by St Paul, that we cease to be Christians the moment our religion becomes slavery to "the Law" rather than a free personal adherence by loving faith, to the risen and living Christ; "Do you seek justification by the Law . . . you are fallen from grace . . . In fact, in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor its absence is of any avail. What counts is faith that expresses itself in love". — T. Merton

These truths of Christ' resurrection on this day challenges us, our faith and really our patience, to believe and to accept that our Christian understanding is made clear by the fact that Christ did rise and rose to heaven to prepare a place for us in His Father's house. Many skeptics in our secular world dismiss the resurrection altogether, even, unfortunately, some Catholics have concluded that this is but a myth. But I like to believe what happened two thousand years ago is fact and fact derives itself from truth. The truth of the matter is that Christ did resurrect, and He did ascend in heaven. Therefore I believe that Christ is waiting for me and that my soul will unite with Him and His heavenly Father. Happy Easter and God bless.
