### A Word from the Pastor

Today as I sit here at my desk writing this article, I am reminded of how short our stay is on this earth. I do not mean to sound maudlin, but there is some sadness I am experiencing as my time here comes to a close.

Last Tuesday, May 18th, I celebrated my eighth anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood, and I started thinking about my life in general and the last eight years in particular. There are times when one wonders whether or not we contributed anything of significance to our society or whether something we said or did made any difference at all. Then you start to get letters, cards and emails declaring what a difference you made in someone's life or how you inspired someone to deepen their faith. That is when you realize the contributions you made to a particular person or community. That is when you also realize the sin of pride. A friend of mine once said as I was bemoaning my perceived failures as a pastor, suggested I "get rid of my ego". I did not pay much attention to those words then, but after a while I started to understand what he meant by saying, "get rid of your ego". Pride can sometimes be detrimental and as such can damage relationships with family, friends and neighbor. Pride as defined thus: a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction derived from one's own achievements". Pride in achieving something is good, but when pride interferes with one's ability to conduct oneself in a manner conducive to relating to others, then it becomes problematic. The Catechism of the Catholic Church views pride in this way: "It is essentially an act or disposition of the will desiring to be considered better than a person really is"... "it can lead to all sorts of sins, notably presumption, ambition, vainglory, boasting, hypocrisy, strife, and disobedience. Pride strives for perverse excellence. It despises others and, depending on its perversity, even looks down upon God." Pride for me should be my silence, keeping the ego at bay, and not allowing it to cloud my point of view. Do not get me wrong, I am very proud of the things I accomplished with others at this parish, I am proud of you for your support of the many parish events we worked on and planned together as a community. What is wrong, in my opinion, is that I wanted that pat on the back, and "good job" father. And I did receive those pats on the back, but my ego, my pride, clouded my view and for this I am ashamed. I am proud of you and I know you appreciate all that I have done here. The ego can be a dangerous thing and one should never allow that beast from emerging and muddling one's mind or decisions. God bless.
