### FIRST WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & THE ELDERLY

The Vatican has released Pope Francis' message for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, which will be celebrated on Sunday 25th of July, To express the closeness of God and of the church to every older person, Pope Francis has chosen "I am with you always" from the Gospel of Matthew as the theme for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly.

"I am with you always" (Mt 28:20): this is the promise the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended into heaven. Pope Francis emphasized in his message that the Lord is always with us and always calling us to play a role in spreading the Gospel no matter our age. "I was called to become the Bishop of Rome when I had reached, so to speak, retirement age and thought I would not be doing anything new. The Lord is always - always - close to us. He is close to us with new possibilities, new ideas, new consolations, but always close to us. You know that the Lord is eternal; he never, ever goes into retirement. "They are the words that he repeats to you today, dear grandfathers and grandmothers, dear elderly friends. "I am with you always" are also the words that I, as Bishop of Rome and an elderly person like yourselves, would like to address to you on this first World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!

### Gospel: John 6:1-15

The Gospel reading comes from the beginning of the Bread of Life discourse, in which Jesus will reveal that he is the eternally nourishing bread of life (John 6:51). In the portion that we read today, Jesus crosses the sea (6:1),leads a crowd (6:2), and goes up onto a mountain (6:3) — actions that echo Moses' leadership of the people in Exodus. When the crowd is gathered, and Jesus "had given thanks" (eucharisteō), the bread and fish donated by a young boy become a nourishing meal for about five thousand people, with twelve baskets of leftovers. The baskets of leftovers suggest that this bread,

broken and shared in thankfulness, continues to nourish the people even beyond the immediate moment.

In keeping with the theme of Grandparents Day, we are invited to reflect on how our grandparents' life experiences might shape our own. We can ask them, "what 'bread' of life experiences can you share with me?

At this weekend's Masses, we invite our grandparents and elders to be honored with a special blessing. Let us always keep them in our prayers.

The Assumption of Mary is the teaching that: The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Pope Pius XII in his apostolic letter Munificentissimus Deus defined as dogma the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on November 1, 1950! This happy occasion points us to have cause for hope. Pope Pius wrote "it is our hope that belief in Mary's bodily Assumption into heaven will make our belief in our own resurrection stronger and render it more effective."

Let us Pray: Oh God who created us as a substantial unity of body and spirit, we thank you for our mother Mary, who's Assumption reminds us of our own destiny: to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of our lives.
