All Saints Day

The Solemnity of All Saints, Nov. 1, is an opportunity to study, learn from, and celebrate the saints.

The Solemnity of All Saints pays homage to the women and men officially recognized by the Catholic Church for their holiness. They inspire us to grow in holiness to join them one day in heaven. Whether prominent or obscure, saints are ready, willing and able to help us on life's journey. All we need to do is ask them to pray for us.

Quoting from "Popular Devotional Practices," U.S. Conference **Catholic** of Bishops state that through their prayers of intercession, the saints in heaven play an integral role in the life of the Church on earth. "For after they have been received into their heavenly home and are present to the Lord, through Him and with Him and in Him they do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, showing forth the merits which they won on earth through the one Mediator between God and man." The saints, the members of the Church who have arrived at perfect union with Christ, join their wills to the will of God in praying for those in the Church who are still on their pilgrimage of faith.

By practicing love of the saints we strengthen the unity of the entire Body of Christ in the Spirit. This in turn brings us all closer to Christ.

Pope Francis, writing in "Gaudete et Exsultate" ("Rejoice and Be Glad"), stated that the Lord "wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence." Following Christ, or the path to holiness, is a way of life. The pope cited the lives of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Teresa of Calcutta and many others for whom "mental prayer, the love of God and the reading of the Gospel in no way detracted from their passionate and effective commitment to their neighbors."

The Catechism of the Catholic

Church refers to them as "witnesses who have preceded us into the kingdom," who share the living tradition of prayer by the example of their lives, their writing and their prayer today.

Mass will be celebrated **Monday Nov. 1 at 8:15am**. The Eighth Graders are sponsoring this special mass which will be live streamed for those who are unable to attend in person.

All Souls' Day

On the Feast of All Souls, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. we pray for the souls of those who have died. There is a **Book of Remembrance** that is available at the foot of the altar for family members to write names of loved ones. There is a special **Ofrenda Altar** that has been set up where the portrait of Our Lady of Guadalupe currently hangs. You are invited to bring a small framed photo of your loved ones for this altar. To be able to return pictures, we ask that parishioners put their name and phone number on the back of their pictures, along with the name of the person in the picture. Please pick up your portraits by Friday, November 12. After that time, they can be obtained in the vestibule history chapel of the Church. Remembrance envelopes are available in the back of the church. A wonderful way to cherish those we love so much and to honor their lives as the gifts they will forever you may write the names of your deceased loved ones on the envelopes.

We invite you to an All Souls' Day Mass in remembrance of our family and friends who passed away during the past year. There will be two Masses celebrated by Father John on Tuesday, November 2, at 8:15am and at 7:00pm. The evening mass students will be participating. We invite all School families to join our Assumption Community Mass.
