#### **Rejoice! Third Sunday of Advent**

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The Third Sunday of Advent is also known as *Gaudete* Sunday. The word "*gaudete*" is derived from the Latin words "*gaudium*," joy, and "*gaudeo*," to rejoice or be glad. The nearness of Christmas is reason for great joy. The joyful rose color used this week offers us to focus on the uplifting, upcoming joyful celebration of the Nativity.

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Gaudete is taken from the Entrance Antiphon: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near" (paraphrase, Phil 4:4-5). Advent is a time of joyful expectation and eager preparation for the Solemnity of Christmas.

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There is joy in looking forward to the annual celebration of Christmas, but there is also joy in recalling the birth of Jesus on the first Christmas. The joy is heightened because he was born to save us from our sins (Mt 1:21b). The joy also extends to anticipation of the Second Coming, either at the end of physical life or the end of the world, the time when believers will be given the crown of righteousness (2 Tm 4:8) and a place in the Father's house (Jn 14:2) to dwell with God and his angels and saints for all eternity.

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In an *Angelus* address for *Gaudete* Sunday Pope Francis he encouraged us to remain joyful "even when things do not go according to our desires. Anxieties, difficulties and sufferings permeate our lives, and so many times the reality around us seems to be inhospitable and arid, like the desert in which the voice of John the Baptist resounded, as the Gospel of today recalls."

As Henri Nouwen says, "Joy does not simply happen to us. We have to choose joy and keep choosing it every day." Luckily, Gaudete Sunday provides us a perfect opportunity to do just that as we head toward the end of Advent, culminating in the perfect joy of Christ's birth.

Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.-Is 12:6.

There are only 50 of these images in existence. One for every state in the Union. Having touched the original "Tilma" at the Basilica in Mexico City, this image is a second degree relic. We invite you to join us this weekend and take a moment to approach & touch the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe to receive her powerful intercessions of your prayers.

Let us then continue to pray for all our ministers that they may remain faithful and committed in this mission that God has entrusted to each one of them.

## One of the most famous Advent traditions is the Advent wreath

There is much rich symbolism to be found in this beautiful tradition.

The Advent candles remind us that Jesus is the light of the world. Each Sunday of Advent we light another candle as we get closer and closer to Christmas - the moment Jesus brought light into our darkness.

Three of these candles are purple and one is pink (or rose). The dark purple also reminds us of darkness and marks a time for prayer and waiting. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent which is called Gaudete Sunday, meaning 'Rejoice' for the time of Christmas is near.

The circular shape of the wreath reminds us of our God, who has no beginning or end, as well as His endless love for us. The evergreen leaves that make up the wreath remind us that God gives us the gift of everlasting life through Jesus.
