



A Word from the Pastor

Another Easter has come and gone and now we find ourselves in the first week in the Octave of Easter. Some of you might be asking, “What is the Octave of Easter?”

Last Sunday our community celebrated Jesus’ Resurrection from the dead, the day Christ, as in the rolling back of the stone from the tomb, opens the gates of heaven to us. The act God made of sacrificing His Son in order to reconcile our relationship with Him was the primary reason for Jesus’ birth, death and ultimately His resurrection. The five readings we heard at the Easter Vigil Liturgy are scriptural readings from both the Old and New Testaments of God’s desire to resolve the separation our original parents committed when they disobeyed God in the garden by eating the “forbidden” fruit. This Salvation story through the ages by covenantal act, demonstrates God’s unconditional love for His creation. But not only that; this act shows an even deeper meaning of love that is harder to fathom and which no words can describe.

What does octave mean? Octave, according to the Webster Dictionary, means: “*a period of eight days beginning with the day of a Church festival*”. As you read above, the Octave of Easter refers to an eight-day period commencing with that feast, in this particular case, Easter. Presently in the Western Church, Easter is one of only two solemnities that carries an octave, the other being Christmas Day. This, like other times in the church calendar is a period for us to pray, sacrifice and ponder our own relationship with God our Father. In the coming weeks, and as the liturgical calendar continues, I hope we can use this time to understand our relationship with God and with each other. This should be a time in which we take stock of our own love for family and friends. It is a time to think about how we can help our parish community through volunteering and almsgiving.

I want to take this opportunity to thank our many volunteers who put in numerous hours of their personal time and talents to give us beautiful liturgies. The music was, as usual, wonderful. Bill does such a great job with our small but incredible choir. I want to thank Margaret Daly and Gordon Hom for sharing their incredible voices with us, always giving our parish their very best. In addition to them, I want to thank Phoang and David Hathaway and the environment ministry for their talents and all the hard work they did in beautifying our church during these high holy days. Also, to Cathy Ralph and all the lectors, a big thank you for coming forward and helping out. And let me not forget to say thanks to the altar servers, to Mike Sequeira and his son, Andrew, for the vigil fire, to Mary Schirmer for the Easter egg hunt and to all of you for being a part of this faithful and caring parish. I’m sure the Blessed Mother is looking down from heaven and protecting us from harm. May the Blessed Mother be a strong part of our parish for many years to come. God bless.

From Today’s Gospel Reading

4. Don't forget to **click "submit" at the bottom of the page!** You will receive an email once your enrollment form is processed.


