

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Gospel Reading John 14:1–12 Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the way and the truth and the life."

Jesus tells his disciples that he is going to prepare a place for them in his Father's house. He promises that where he is going, his disciples will be able to follow. Thomas, who will later doubt the disciples' reports that they have seen the Risen Lord, contradicts Jesus by saying that the disciples don't know where Jesus is going or how to get there. Jesus explains that he himself is the way, the truth, and the life. In knowing and loving Jesus, the disciples now love God the Father.

Philip then makes a request that challenges Jesus' words. Philip wants Jesus to show the Father to the disciples. Recall that Jesus has just told his disciples, "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." As a good teacher, Jesus responds to Philip by repeating and elaborating on what he has just told the disciples: they have seen and known Jesus, so they have seen and known the Father. Then Jesus offers another reassurance about his departure: because of faith in God and in Jesus, the disciples will do the work that Jesus has done and more.

The connection between Jesus and his Father, between Jesus' work and the work of the Father, is made clear in today's Gospel. Jesus is in the Father, and God the Father is in Jesus. As God spoke his name to Moses, "I am," so too Jesus speaks his name to his disciples: "I am the way and the truth and the life."


The revelation of the Trinity is completed in the passage that follows today's reading, and it is the Gospel for next Sunday. Because Jesus goes away, the Father will send in Jesus' name the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will continue the work of the Father and of Jesus.

Members of the same family often bear close resemblances to one another. Sometimes physical 2

resemblances are shared within a family, but often the similarities are behavioral characteristics and mannerisms. We hear this observation affirmed through a number of common phrases: "He's a chip off the old block" or "She's her mother's daughter." Today's Gospel points to a mystery of faith that might be examined in light of these familial relationships. In Jesus we see and know the Father. Likewise, the Father is known through the life and work of the Son, Jesus.

Talk together as a family about whether people outside of your family recognize common traits of your family. Are there physical resemblances that people recognize and so know each individual as a member of your family? Are there mannerisms that are shared by members of your family? What are some common interests and work that people might associate with your family? As you read today's Gospel, John 14:1-12, keep in mind that members of the same family share many characteristics, even though each person in the family is an individual. What does Jesus tell his disciples about his relationship with the Father? The relationship between the Father and Jesus is so close that Jesus says that those who have seen nd known the Father. Jesus promises his disciples that because of their faith in him and in the Father, they too will be able to do the work of the Father as Jesus did. End your discussion by praying together that others will recognize in your family the work of the Father. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

St Vincent de Paul Reaching our Neighbors in Need

The Assumption St Vincent de Paul Conference is blessed to be able to reach out and serve our neighbors in need. This is only possible because YOU, Assumption Parishioners, support us with your generosity in gifts of food, funds, and goods. Following is a story of our neighbor Sally who called our helpline. Note: Sally is not her real name. SVDP maintains strict confidentiality with our neighbors' identities.

Our Saint Vincent de Paul Conference was recently blessed to help an inspirational and kind member of our community. She has been a widow for a few years and recently sent her adult child to college out of state. She has endured multiple health problems, but still found work to keep her stable and financially afloat. We first received a call from her on our Help Line when she expressed having difficulty paying her latest PG&E bill. When we arrived at her home for a visit, she welcomed us and shared how her life had become harder during the pandemic restrictions. She had lost many hours on her job, lacked transportation, and was often low on food. She had been managing everything until her child's departure depleted her resources, but she was confident that her new hours would get her back to normal. She told us that the thing that kept her going was her belief and faith in God; despite being alone most days, she was never fearful because she knew God was always with her. As we supplied her with our donated food, and arranged to pay most of her bill, she gave us a warm smile and a most sincere thank you. She informed us that our visit truly brought her hope for her next days. We prayed with her and she began to cry, thanking the Lord for our help. We asked God to protect her and cover her with God's love always, and guide her to better days. As we said our goodbyes, we were moved by the Holy Spirit: renewed, inspired and grateful to be a part of such a positive, loving experience. Bringing help to someone in need does that. We hope that other parishioners who are similarly moved will join us in this work of outreach to Jesus among us
