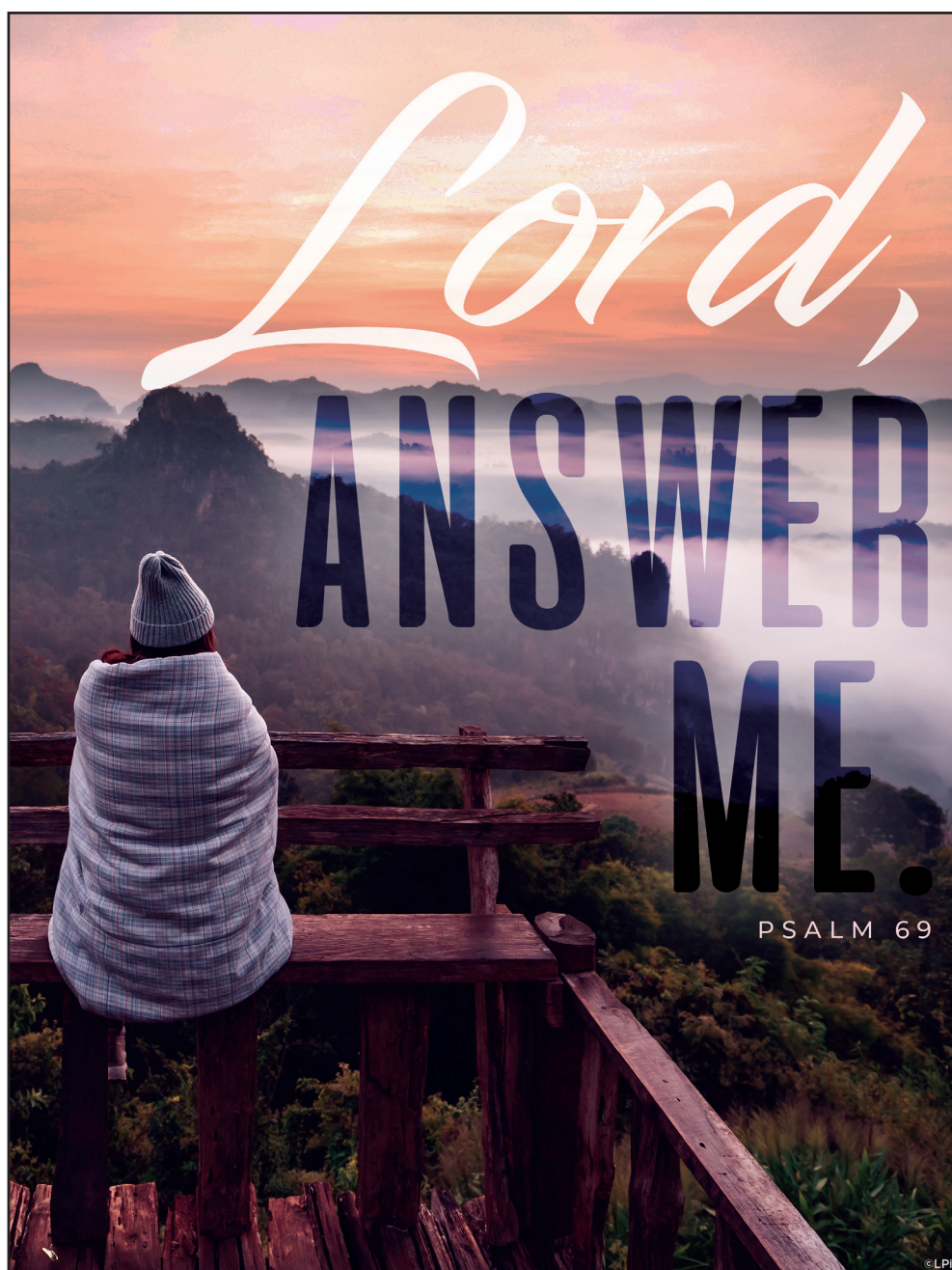

Twelfth Week in Ordinary Time

The Perfect Love and Knowledge of God

“Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father’s knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.” Matthew 10:29-31

It’s comforting to know that the All-Powerful God of the Universe knows every detail about our lives and is deeply concerned about every single detail. He knows us infinitely better than we know ourselves and He loves each one of us more deeply than we could ever love ourselves. These facts should give us much peace.

Imagine the truth contained in this Scripture above. God even knows how many hairs we have on our head! This is stated as a way of emphasizing the depth of intimacy by which God knows us.

When we can come to the realization of the Father’s perfect knowledge of us AND His perfect love of us, we will be in a position to put our complete trust in Him. Trust in God is only possible when we understand Who we are trusting. And when we do begin to more completely understand Who God is and how much He cares about every detail of our lives, we will more easily entrust to Him those details, allowing Him to take control of all.

Reflect, today, upon these basic truths of God’s perfect knowledge of us and His perfect love. Sit with those truths and ponder them. As you do, allow them to become the basis of an invitation from God to let go of your own control of life in favor of His control. Try to make an act of total surrender to Him and you will begin to discover the freedom that comes with this surrender.

Father in Heaven, I thank You for Your perfect knowledge of every detail of my life. I thank You, also, for Your perfect love. Help me to trust in this love and to trust in Your daily invitation to surrender all. I do surrender my life to You, dear Lord. Help me to surrender more fully this day. 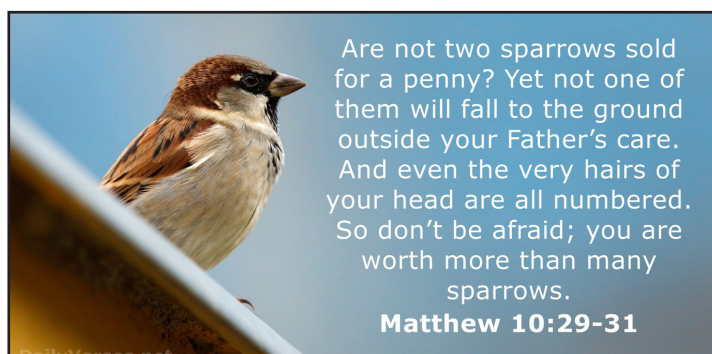
Sunday Family Connection

It is not only individuals who need reassurance about God’s love and protection. Communities need this reassurance as well, including the community of the family. Children rely on the confidence of their parents for this assurance. Parents can help the entire family’s growth in trust and confidence in God by witnessing ways in which daily family needs are entrusted to God’s care.

As the family gathers, distribute pieces of paper to each person. Tell them to write or draw ways in which they believe that God’s help is needed for each person and for the family as a whole. Each slip of paper can then be collected in a basket.

Invite one member of the family to read aloud today’s Gospel, Matthew 10:26-33. Recall together how well God knows your family and thank God for this wonderful grace. Conclude by praying together for each of the needs identified on the slips of paper. After each need is read, pray together, “God, we trust you because you know us so well.” Conclude by praying the Glory Be to the Father.

This practice might become a regular part of your family’s prayer. Set the basket in a place of prayer and encourage family members to add other needs throughout the week. Perhaps your family can pray for these things together during a family meal.

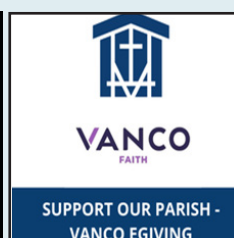

The Real Presence of Christ

Absence makes the heart grow fonder - sometimes! Coming out of the pandemic, most Catholics were eager to come back to Masses in the Church. People are either tired of watching Mass online, want to connect with friends in the parish, miss the ministries they serve or just want to go back to “normal”. Hopefully above all of these and other reasons is our desire to encounter Jesus at Mass and particularly His Real Presence in the Eucharist.

What is the Real Presence of Christ? The Church professes that in ‘the most Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist “the Body and Blood, together with the Soul and Divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, *the whole Christ*, is truly, really, and substantially contained.”’ (CCC 1374) In the person of Christ, priests ‘preside at the Eucharist and consecrate the bread and the wine so that they become the Body and Blood of the Lord.’ (CCC 1411) As Jesus Himself said: “Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him.” (Jn 6:54-56).

Can we fully grasp this teaching? This doctrine is one of the central mysteries of the Catholic faith surpassing human understanding. By mystery it does not mean we cannot know anything about it, but it is a truth that on our own we cannot know everything about. Out of love, God reveals truth to us through the gift of faith and the grace of the Holy Spirit. It is only through the eyes of faith that we can perceive this unique presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

After consecration, the priest prays the anamnesis (calling to mind - “*Do this in memory of Me*”) to make present the Paschal mystery by which Christ accomplished His saving work. In the liturgy, we are not just spectators but active participants, present at the table of the Lord and at the foot of His cross with our Blessed Mother mystically connected to the divine eternity. The Eucharist cures and protects us from amnesia (opposite of *anamnesis*), against forgetting that the Lord is with us. He calls and sends us to be His real presence to the world.

In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Christ comforts us, empowers us, forgives us and profoundly connects us all through our union with Him. Reconstructing the saying above, a transformed knowledge of and assent to Christ’s Real Presence make the heart grow fonder of the Lord.
