

# **Sixteenth Week in Ordinary Time Gospel Reading Matthew 13:24–43**

The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed

Taken together, the parables found in today's Gospel offer both a sobering reminder about the Kingdom of God and words of encouragement. As the wheat and the weeds must grow together until the harvest, so we may not know whether our actions contribute to God's Kingdom until God's final judgment. With this word of caution in mind, we act always in prayer that our actions will be consistent with God's plans. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we hear words of encouragement. God can bring the Kingdom of Heaven from even the smallest of beginnings. Thus, we ask God to work through us for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Set aside some time this week to make bread with your family. Show the amount of yeast that is required to raise an entire batch of bread. Observe that little things can go a long way. After the bread has been baked, gather together as a family. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 13:24-43. Reflect together on what Jesus means when he teaches that the Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed and like yeast. In these parables, Jesus is teaching us that God can work wonders from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of God. This means that even the little things that we do can make a big difference in the lives of others. What are some of the little things that we can do in our family that help to make things better for others? Decide on one action to take together. In what ways can you actively protect and nurture the "wheat" in your own heart and in the world around you?

Reflect on a small act of faith, love, or kindness that had a significant impact in your life or the life of someone else. How did it grow and spread?

Consider the influence you have on others through your words, actions, and attitudes. Are you spreading the "yeast" of love, hope, and faith in your interactions?

# **Our Lady, Mother of Divine Grace**

Feast Day July 23

We honour Mary as Our Lady, Mother of Divine Grace since she is the Mother of the Son of God, the Author of Grace. 'The Blessed Virgin Mary was eternally predestined, in the context of the Incarnation of the divine Word, to be the Mother of God. As decreed by divine Providence, she served on earth as the loving Mother of the divine Redeemer, His associate, uniquely generous, and the Lord's humble servant. She conceived, bore, and nourished Christ; presented Him to the Father in the Temple; and was united with Him in His suffering as He died on the cross. In a completely unparalleled way she cooperated, by her obedience, faith, hope and burning charity, with our Saviour's work of restoring supernatural life to souls. For this reason she is Mother to us all in the order of grace' (Lumen Gentium, the Constitution on the Church, 61).

Saint Mary the Virgin is Mother of divine grace because grace and truth come through Jesus Christ (cf. John 1:17). The Lord Jesus comes to us, grace comes to us, through Our Lady. The Archangel Saint Gabriel says of Mary: "Hail, full of Grace, the Lord is with you..." (Luke 1:28). We are able to be full of grace too, thanks to God's goodness and Our Lady's cooperation with God's grace. May we always cooperate with God's grace, renouncing sin and Satan and the glamour of evil while pursuing holiness. The sacraments, especially Baptism, Eucharist and Penance, are for us the ordinary channels of grace. The residual graces of Confirmation, Marriage and Orders dispose us similarly, to live holy lives always pleasing to God.

O God, you gave the human race the grace of forgiveness through the immaculate motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary; grant that we who call her the Mother of Grace on earth, may enjoy her happy presence forever in heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

# School Pastors' Institute (SPI)

Last week Father John attended the 2023 SPI summer conference on the campus of the University of Notre Dame.

SPI is leadership formation symposium for pastors of Catholic schools. This four-day conference was designed to respond to the unique and increasingly complex challenges and opportunities related to serving as a pastor of a parish school. Since 2011, the SPI has formed and served 1,208 pastors from 148 different (arch)dioceses to look more closely at the crucial role that the pastor plays in the parish school, as well as to foster best practices and collaboration among those engaged in this vital ministry. Now, more than ever, we need pastors who understand, support, and advocate for Catholic schools.

In attendance were 94 priests from across the nation. The Diocese of Oakland was well represented by Fr. John, Fr Erick, Father Jimmy, and Fr. Michael. As a special treat during the conference they got a special tour of Notre Dame Stadium by football chaplain and Director of ACE's Blended Learning Initiatives, Fr. Nate Wills, CSC.
