# SUNDAY GOSPEL Reflection

## Gospel for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Year A Matthew 23:1-12

Jesus warns against following the example of the scribes and the Pharisees and teaches that those who would be great must be servants.

“Do as I say, not as I do.” How many of us have been tempted to say this to our children? In today’s Gospel we hear a resounding reply from Jesus, “Practice what you preach.” Those who know us best, our family and especially our children, can identify the inconsistencies between what we want to teach and the example that we give. The challenge for all of us, especially for those of us who are parents, is to model with consistency the faith and the Christian way of life we wish to teach our children.

As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to practice what you preach. Identify some examples of people you know who practice what they preach. What do you observe about these people? What do you admire about them?

In today’s Gospel, we hear Jesus talk about the importance of acting in ways that are consistent with our faith. Talk together about ways in which your family might better practice the faith that you profess. Choose one action to take that will show your faith in action. Pray together that your family’s faith will be shown consistently in your actions.

Take a few moments to think of something kind or helpful you can do for someone else. It can be something small. Maybe you can try to do it without the other person finding out it was you! We can take joy in knowing we made the other person happy. We can know that we glorify God when we help others. We don’t need any other recognition.

## San Leandro Warming Shelter Call for Cooks

The City of San Leandro and Housing Consortium of the East Bay (HCEB) have announced they will be opening the 2023/24 San Leandro Warming Shelter on November 15, 2023 till next spring. The Shelter will operate at First United Methodist Church located at 1600 Bancroft Avenue.

This Shelter is a weather dependent shelter providing respite from extreme cold and/or rain over the course of the winter season when our homeless population is most vulnerable to the elements. We are looking for cooking crews who would like to sign up for one, two or four nights per month.

The exception to the weather dependent operation of the Shelter will be Tuesdays. The Shelter will be open from 12:00 pm (noon) until 8:00 pm if the weather is not cold or rainy so we may keep in contact with our guests and ensure continuity with them. For the season, we will need cooks every Tuesday night to bring in dinner.

The number of guests to start with this year will probably be in the 12-15 person range at least initially. The food we are asking for is hot, hearty, family style food – pasta, soup, stew, mac & cheese, chili etc. There should be a main course, a veggie or salad (may be contained in the soup/stew etc.), a starch (bread/rolls/corn bread/pasta etc.) and if possible a dessert – cookies/baked goods etc. The Shelter will provide all utensils, plates, bowls, cups, glasses, napkins, coffee, punch, sugar/creamers, breakfast items such as toast, sweet rolls, juice, milk, cereal or oatmeal, and fresh fruit. Cooks will bring the food to FUMC and be ready to serve our guests between 6:00 PM and 6:30 PM each night we are open.
