Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: All flesh shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia, alleluia. -LK 3:4, 6

SUNDAY GOSPEL Reflection

Gospel for the Second Sunday of Advent, Year B MK 1:1-8

One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.

Embracing Humility and Repentance

John the Baptist exemplifies humility, a virtue essential for Advent preparation. He acknowledges his role as merely the forerunner to someone greater – Jesus. John's humility in recognizing his place in God's plan is a powerful model for us. In our parish communities and personal lives, embracing humility like John's allows us to make room for others to lead and for God's work to be done through them.

Our Advent journey, then, is marked by a dual movement: inward, to confront and repent of our sins, and outward, to embrace humility and allow God to work through us and others. As we reflect on the messages of Isaiah and John the Baptist for the 2nd Sunday of Advent Year B, we're invited to smooth the path for Christ's coming into our hearts and communities, transforming our lives in anticipation of His arrival. This preparation is not just an Advent exercise but a continual call to live in alignment with the divine will, guided by Jesus, our shepherd, who leads us out of the exile of sin into the embrace of God's love.

- In what ways can you practice 'active patience' during Advent, using this time not just to wait but to grow and prepare spiritually?
- How does the concept of repentance manifest in your life, and what steps can you take this Advent to deepen your understanding and practice of it?
- Reflect on John the Baptist's humility. How can you incorporate this virtue into your own life, especially in your interactions within your parish community and personal relationships?

Advent Week 2: Peace

Pray Around the Advent Wreath:

Leader: Come Holy Spirit! In this second week of Advent, we ask You to fill our hearts with peace as we prepare for Christ's coming.

All: Come, Lord Jesus.

Family member lights the first and second purple advent candles.

Leader: Lord, we ask to receive the peace of Your Holy Spirit throughout this week and especially right now as we pray together as a family. Help us to be peacemakers, sharing Your peace within our home and beyond.

All: Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Help us make room in our hearts; help us clear out all that is not from You, so that the Holy Spirit might fill us with the fruits of eternal life and happiness. As we prepare for Jesus' coming, let Your peace fill our hearts and minds; let Your peace inform our words, actions, and attitudes.

All: Fill our hearts with hope and peace! Amen.

During this second week of Advent, we reflect on our lives and orient ourselves toward Christ's coming, preparing our hearts to receive Him anew.

Nativity reminds us: Sacrifice part of our own journey

Notable in many homes every Christmas season is the creche, otherwise known to many of us as the Nativity scene. Officially, it represents the scene at Jesus Christ's birth, and it is displayed at homes and churches and public spaces during Christmas in various places around the world.

Unofficially, it is the scene of a mom, a new and young mom who said yes to God's promises and after a grueling trip to Bethlehem during the last stages of her pregnancy — found that there was no place for her to rest along with her husband and, later, newborn child.

Her "yes" had come resiliently when Mary saw the angel, heard the words and trusted her God. But that was then. This scene, daunting by anyone's measure, had to be sobering to a vulnerable mother. Even under those trying circumstances, Mary still soldiered on. Hers was a "yes" that would grow more costly in time, when her child wandered, when he grew into a man and when he died violently on a cross after suffering humiliation and physical pain.

Mary's was an expensive "yes," and yet the angel had told Mary that God would be with her. The funny thing about God's promises is that they sound like what we most want to hear. However, knee-deep in the middle of them, they look nothing as we imagined them.

Sometimes what we yearn for looks good, seems reasonable. We never imagine that the reality may also mean hardship. But as time passes, we realize that sacrifice is part of the journey, and we tether ourselves to God and walk one step at a time, obediently saying "yes".

We experience God, even if it's among the stinky animals, like Mary and her child did in that stable. There is nothing, nothing, nothing like nestling in the promises of God, especially when the promises are big ones. Remember that he promised Mary he would be with her each step of the way, and he kept that promise.

May our Nativity scene at Christmas remind us this season of the possibilities that begin with our simple, small, flawed but willing "yes" and carry on with a God who honors his promises to those like Mary.
